Getting lost	Injury/harm caused by un-familiar surroundings	Participants	Course route to be identified using markers. Marshals to be positioned at prominent places especially where there is a change of direction
Exposure to cold, wet and sun	Hypothermia, exhaustion	Participants	Qualified First Aiders to be on hand around the course. Accident and Incident procedure in place, includes details of the radio network
Uneven ascents	Shortage of breath, dizziness	Participants	Qualified First Aiders to be on hand around the course. Accident and Incident procedure in place, includes details of the radio network
Uneven descents	Slipping, tripping	Participants	Qualified First Aiders to be on hand around the course. Accident and

Falls from heights	Slipping, falling – fractures, sprains, danger of death	Participants and Volunteers	Warnings to be given to keep away from escarpment edge. Marshals to be positioned at danger points
